IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- This product should not be used near water, for example, near a bathtub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement, or a swimming pool.
- 5. Slots and openings in the cabinet back or bottom are provided for ventilation, to protect it from over-heating. These openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the product on the bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. The product should not be placed in a built-in installation unless proper ventilation is provided.





INTRODUCTION

Congratulations on your purchase of this innovative new telecommunications device. This Audissey Earphone was developed to provide you with a new level of freedom in making and receiving phone calls: two free hands! In the past, in order to get this beneficial feature, an uncomfortable wrap around earset was your only choice. This product because of it's innovative design reduces the usual fatigue associated with normal telephone handset use. This phone enables you to perform your normal two handed functions while conversing comfortably. It is a fact that a high percentage of neck, shoulder, and back problems are related to the poor posture normal handset users are accustomed to when attempting to wedge the handset between the shoulder and ear. The sculptured silicone earbud covers provided will comfortably secure the earset to your ear so that you almost forget it is there. Please take a few minutes to read this entire owner's manual to learn all about this special product. Because this is not a standard telephone, there are many details which you must become familiar with to install, use, and care for your new Audissey Earphone product. LOCATION AND FUNCTION OF CONTROLS






INSTALLATION

This telephone can be placed on either a convenient flat surface (desk/table) or easily mounted on a wall. For either, be sure to select a location that's accessible to a modular wall jack. If your installation is on a flat surface, make sure that it is sturdy and stable. Serious damage can occur if your Audissey Earphone is allowed to fall. Follow these easy steps to install your Audissey Earphone.

- Insert one of the modular plugs of the line cord into either of the modular jacks on the rear
 of the base unit. Insert the modular plug on the other end of the line cord into a standard
 telephone jack. (figure 3) If the modular plug from this telephone does not fit exactly into
 your standard telephone jack, you will need an adapter between the telephone outlet and
 the modular plug (RJ-11) of your phone set. (figure 3).
- Set the Tone/Pulse switch (located under the retractor cover) to the desired position (if you are not sure, check with your phone company.)
- 3. NOTE: Make sure that the RECEIVE VOLUME CONTROL (slide control on the front of the base) is set to a lower level so that you may adjust it to your own needs. Check for a dialtone by listening to the earset. If you do not hear one, make sure that your modular connections are snugly seated into their jacks.

WALL MOUNTING


Mounting the Unit on a wall: (FIGURE 5)

As noted above, position the location for your wall mounting installation close to a modular telephone jack.

- Utilize the plastic wall mounting bracket as a template to mark the points where two screws (not included) should be inserted into the wall (NOTE: screws should be inserted to within 1/8 inch of the wall.)
- Attach the plastic wall mounting bracket to the back of the telephone base by inserting the top tabs into the horizontal slots. While pinching the vertical tabs, apply a gentle pressure to firmly seat the bracket to the base.
- Align the screw heads with the eye-slots on the mounting bracket. Once alignment is accomplished, gently but firmly press in a downward direction to seat the phone on to the eye slots.
- Use the sculptured "channels" on the back of the wall mounting bracket to run the telephone line. Connect it to the base where WALL is indicated.
- Complete the wall mount installation by plugging the modular phone plug into the wall jack.
- The wall mounting bracket may also be attached directly to a wall jack with mounting studs (available at telephone supply stores.)


EARSET (Figure 6)

The Earset (ear piece) makes this telephone unique. This small unit substitutes for the normal handset in a standard telephone. The earset is comprised of two parts: the earbud and the 2 inch directional microphone. The design and quality of this tiny microphone is more than enough to pick up all of the sound necessary to carry on a normal phone conversation with the same sound quality as a standard handset. In order to send and receive "accurate sound", adjustments must be made to custom-fit the ear piece to your own physical dimensions. The physical size and shape of the human ear varies, therefore, an assortment of earbud coverings is included to enable a close, comfortable fit.

Sculptured Silicone Earbud Coverings

If you look closely at the sculptured earbud coverings, you will see a marking indicating which piece is sized for each ear (left or right), (FIGURE 6)

The coverings are easily installed on the earbud by following these instructions:

- 1. Decide which ear will be the used with the earset.
- 2. Choose the correct size covering.
- Look closely at the earbud covering and determine the different physical curves that you will need to be aware of in the following steps, The SOUND CHANNEL (the hole at the top of the small volcano shape), and the SECURING CURVE (that appears like a small wave.)
- 4. The earbud portion of the earset should be used with the silicone earbud covering. With the covering on, you will be able to secure the earset to your ear. Without the covering on the earbud, any sudden head movements may dislodge the earset.
- 5. TO INSTALL THE SILICONE EARBUD COVERING: (FIGURE 7)
 - a. Position the covering over the earbud with the small securing curve (wave) at the top
 - Gently press the covering over the earbud starting at the top and working all the way around the earbud
 - c. A slight adjustment can be made after the covering is installed on the earbud. If the alignment is not correct for your "custom" fit, it is easier to remove the covering and reposition it, while on the earbud rather then rotating it.
 - d. Periodic cleaning of your earset (described in PRODUCT CARE) will make it necessary to become familiar with the installing and removing process.

CUSTOM ADJUSTMENTS

The earset has the ability to swivel 180° to accommodate both left and right ear usage. The cord should always be positioned on the under-side of the microphone when in use. To swivel the earset, hold the unit by the boom microphone and gently rotate the earbud armature one-half turn (until the sound hole in the earbud covering comes in line with your ear.) As explained above (EARSET and SCULPTURED SILICONE EARBUD COVERINGS), if you switch the earset from one ear to the other (left to right or vice versa) you will need to replace the earbud covering with the one indicated for that ear. Simply follow the above instructions for removing and installing the earbud covering (SILICONE EARBUD COVERINGS STEPS 5A-C).

CLOTHING CLIP


Your Audissey Earphone comes with a convenient clothing clip. When used, it will eliminate tugs and pulls to the earpiece. It should be used if you plan on moving around a great deal. Attach the clip to the cord, and then clip it to a part of your clothing. Leave enough slack between the clip (where it is attached) and the earpiece to allow for head movement (full left and right turning). This slack will reduce tugging on the earpiece.

TO SECURE THE EARSET TO YOUR EAR

- Insert the earset with the microphone pointing toward your shoulder. Note: the securing curve (wave) should be positioned under the antihelix of your ear (see FIGURE 7). The antihelix is the curved fold in your ear that forms a ridge directly above the ear hole canal.
- With the unit gently pressed, rotate the earset so that the boom microphone swings from pointing at your shoulder to pointing toward your mouth.
- 3. The securing curve rotates under the antihelix and becomes more secure as you reach the optimum location (microphone pointing at the mouth.)
 The earbud covering was designed to utilize the ear itself as an anchor for securing the earset and still remain comfortable.

The earset when properly installed will tolerate tugs on the cord but will dislodge if pulled with moderate force. The comfort of this ear piece will become apparent after using your new Audissey Earphone for a short while. The earbud covering is composed of a soft silicone substance that will eventually mold itself to your ear's shape and will practically become invisible to the user over a very short period of time. In order to produce "accurate" sound, the direction boom microphone must be pointing at your mouth.

RETRACTABLE CORD

Your Audissey Earphone comes with a fifteen foot retractable cord that can be gently pulled from its spool mechanism to the desired length. This enables you to roam around your immediate area and have a 15 foot radius of mobility. Measure off the distance that you feel would be needed to cover your area (in your environment) and gently pull that amount of cord from the base unit. To rewind the cord into the spool, insert your finger into the finger slot and carefully wind the spool in a clockwise direction. Your Audissey Earphone has a holder (on the side of the base) that will secure the earset when not in use. Simply insert the microphone tip of the earpiece into the holder on the base.

TONE/PULSE BUTTON

The TONE/PULSE button is located directly under the Retractor cover panel (above the keypad) and is used to change your dialing mode from TONE dialing to PULSE dialing. Your local phone company can answer any questions regarding which service is available for your use.

OPERATION INSTRUCTIONS

To use your new Audissey Earphone: Follow instructions for securing the earset to your ear. (CUSTOM ADJUSTMENTS)

TO MAKE A CALL

- 1. Press the ON/OFF button, you will hear a dialtone.
- 2. Dial the number you wish to call
- 3. When party answers the phone, begin conversation in a normal speaking voice.
- 4. If the remote party has difficulty hearing you (or you have difficulty hearing them), adjust the transmit and/or receive volume controls (on the front of the base) to make the adjustments necessary. (Due to the earset's design, you may have a tendency to speak too loudly during your conversations. The transmit level volume control, when set all the way to the left, will give you standard telephone volume. If you want your voice to transmit louder, move the slide control to the right. Experiment until you find the desired speaking volume that you and your calling party are comfortable with.) (figure 1)

TO ANSWER A CALL

- When the phone rings, insert the earset into your ear (following the above instructions) and then press the ON/OFF button.
- 2. Begin your conversation.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS with SPEAKER PHONE

The convenience of a one touch speaker phone capability adds another dimension to this unique telephone. For completely hands free telephone conversations you may answer calls simply by pressing the SP. PHONE button and begin speaking in a normal voice toward the unit. If you decide to converse using the earset only, secure it to your ear, while conversing, then press the ON/OFF button to engage the earset. Press the SP. PHONE button to disengage the Speaker portion of the phone.

OPERATING WITH AN AUTO DIALER OR COMPUTER

This telephone is equipped with dual (parallel) RJ-11 jacks which enables an "in line" connection with an auto dialer mechanism (like electronic Rolodex) or with a computer (which has a telephone modem and dialing software like "Lotus Organizer") Figure 4 illustrates the easy wiring diagram necessary to connect these accessory options. To operate your Audissey phone using accessory dialers:

- 1. Use the accessory dialer to choose the number you which to dial.
- 2. Execute the accessory's instructions (utilizing the internal modem of the accessory.)

- 3. When connection is secured (you will hear the usual phone ringing sound), press the ON/ Off button (for earset conversing), or the SP. PHONE button (for speaker phone conversing), then disconnect the accessory. Note: if he accessory is not disconnected prior to your conversation, the internal modern will "echo" both your voice and your calling party's. Disconnecting the accessory does NOT disconnect the call because once a connection is made, the parallel jack "holds" the call for your telephone (when you press the ON/OFF or SP. PHONE button.)
- Upon completion of your call simply hang up by pressing either the ON/OFF button or the SP. PHONE button (earset or speaker.)

ON/OFF BUTTON (FIGURE 1)

The ON/OFF button facilitates gaining access to your line similar to removing the handset from a normal telephone. By picking up the handset on a normal phone, the "HOOK SWITCH" becomes activated (you will hear a dial tone or your calling party.) The same thing is accomplished by pressing the ON/OFF button on your Audissey phone. To hang up after a phone call, press the ON/OFF button when you are finished with your conversation.

REDIAL BUTTON (FIGURE 1)

The REDIAL button enables you to call the last number that was called or a number that is busy. To use REDIAL, press the ON/OFF button, listen for the dial tone, press the REDIAL button, and hear the number being automatically dialed.

MUTE BUTTON (FIGURE 1)

The MUTE button enables you to mute the microphone on the earset. This removes the calling party from the sound circuit so you may converse with someone in the room. The calling party will hear silence when muted. You will however be able to hear the calling party speaking. This feature is similar to a HOLD but rather than both you and the calling party being "muted", the MUTE button only mutes your voice to the calling party. When you wish to re-connect with the caller, press the mute button and your voice will be audible.

SP. PHONE BUTTON (FIGURE 1)

The SP. PHONE (speaker phone) button enables you to utilize the telephone by a one touch operation. By pressing the SP. PHONE button, the telephone's speaker is activated and you will hear either hear a dial tone or the party who is calling. You may carry on a normal conversation by speaking in a normal voice in the direction of the phone. To engage the earset, secure it to your ear and press the ON/OFF button, then press the SP. PHONE button and the speaker will become de-activated.

RECEIVE VOLUME CONTROL (FIGURE 1)

The RECEIVE VOLUME slide control (front of the telephone) enables you to adjust the volume of the sound which you hear through the ear piece (or the SPEAKER). This feature is important where loud background noises may require higher levels of sound to hear and understand.

TRANSMIT VOLUME CONTROL (FIGURE 1)

The TRANSMIT VOLUME slide control (front of the telephone) enables the sound level that your caller hears to be increased (or decreased). This feature is important because there may times when confidential conversations might require lower volume, but with the TRANSMIT VOLUME control, the remote party will be able to hear you even in a whisper.

SPEAKER PHONE VOLUME CONTROL

The SPEAKER PHONE volume is controlled by the RECEIVE VOLUME control. If adjustment are necessary move the control to the desire position (while in the SP. PHONE) mode.

RING SELECTOR (FIGURE 2)

The RING SELECTOR (on the side of the telephone) has three positions: high, low and off. Choose the position you wish by moving the selector.

PRODUCT CARE

To keep up the appearance of your Bell Atlantic Audissey phone, follow these simple instructions:

KEEP IT AWAY from heating appliances and devices that generate electrical noise (motors, fluorescent lamps etc.)

DO NOT EXPOSE your phone to direct sunlight.

DO NOT DROP the base or base unit otherwise treat it roughly

TO CLEAN use a Clean soft cloth dampened with water (unplug your phone from the wall outlet.)

NEVER use strong cleaning agents or abrasive powders, this will damage the finish of your phone.

Important suggestion: retain all original packaging and instructions in case you need to ship the phone at a later date.

TROUBLE SHOOTING

PROBLEM No dial tone CAUSE AND SOLUTION check line connections, make sure modular plugs are snug in both wall and phone jack Ear piece doesn't fit check the markings on the silicon earpiece cover to make sure that you have the correct one for your ear (left/right)

Remote party can't hear increase the transmit volume my moving the slide control to the right to increase sound output

Volume too low if you have difficulty hearing, increase the receive volume control by moving the slide control to the right

Volume too high move the receive volume control slide to the left to

decrease sound level

SERVICE

 RJ-11W. This product may not be used with Party Line Service or with Coin Telephone lines.
- Notification to the telephone company: The FCC requires that upon request of your local telephone company, you provide the following information:
 - a. The "line" to which you will connect the telephone equipment (that is, your phone number),
 and
 - b. The Telephone Equipment FCC registration number and ringer equivalence number (REN). These number are on the back or bottom of your telephone equipment.
